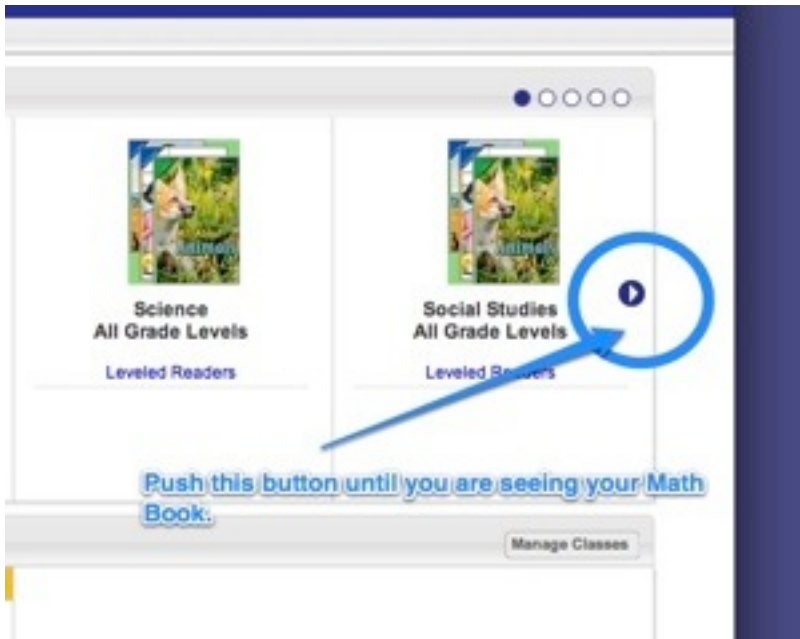


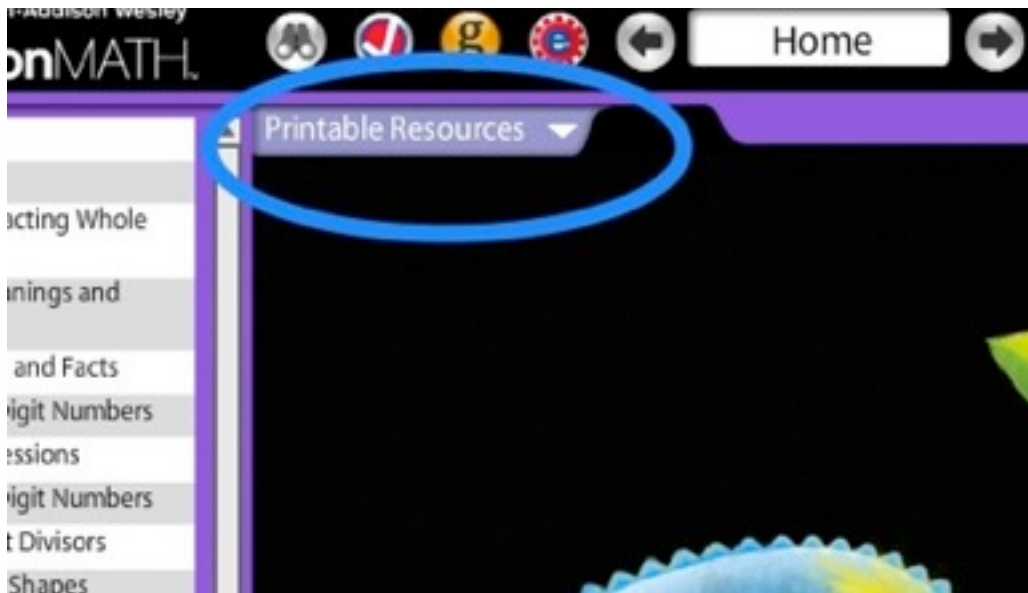
# Saving a PDF to a DropBox Folder Using Pearson Successnet



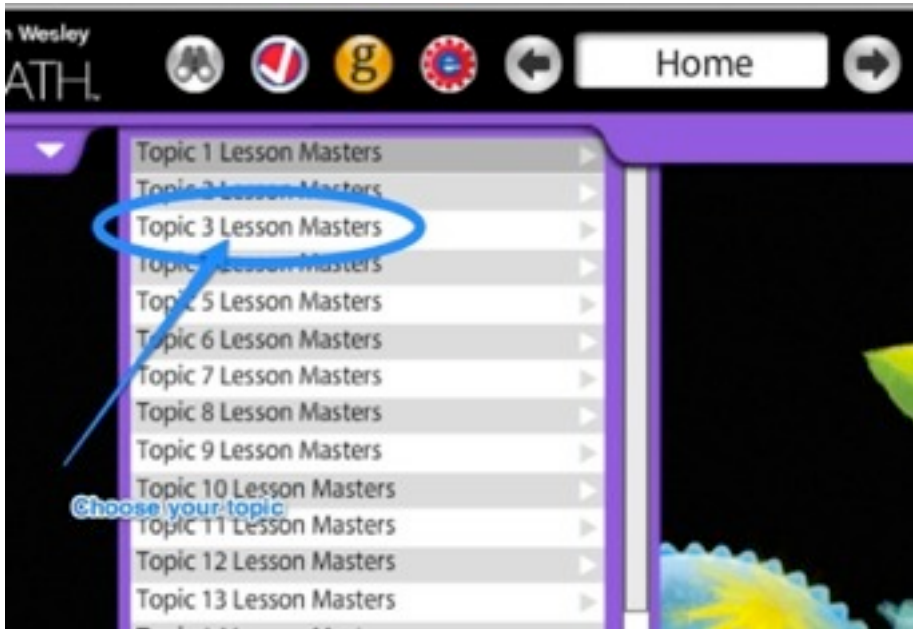
Follow the steps listed below to access your Math worksheets to save them in your Dropbox Folder.

Make sure you click "Teacher Edition" to access all the print materials (blacklines).

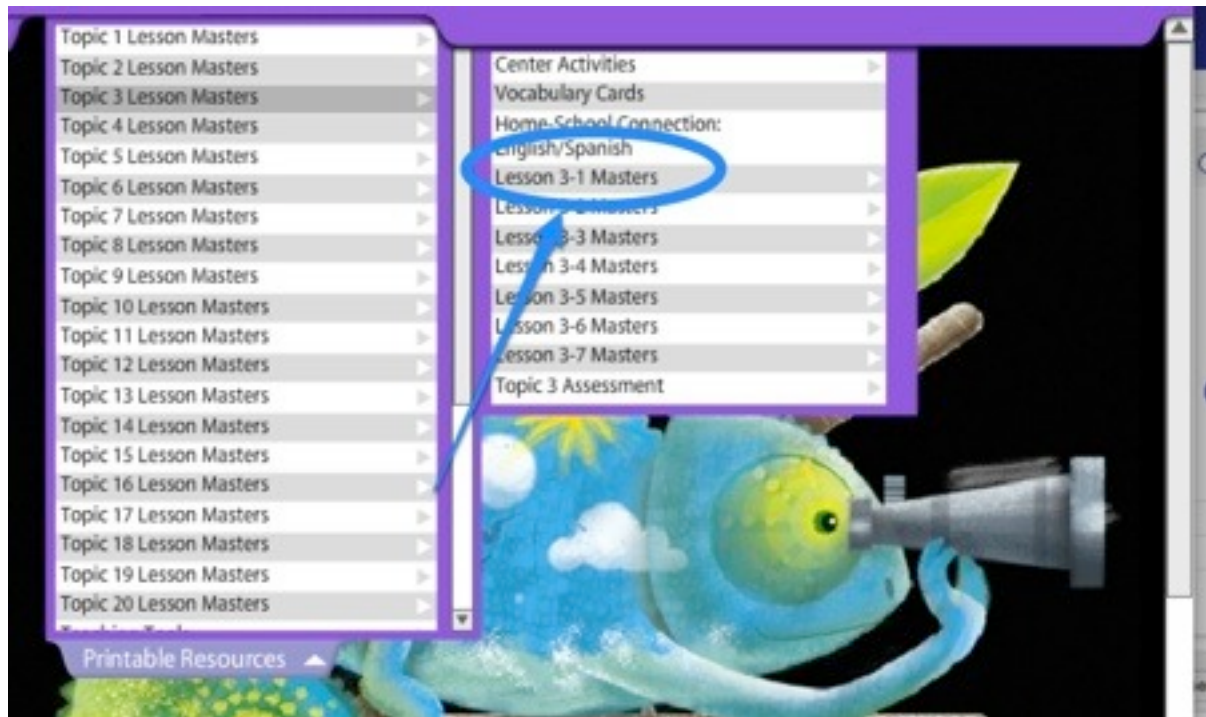


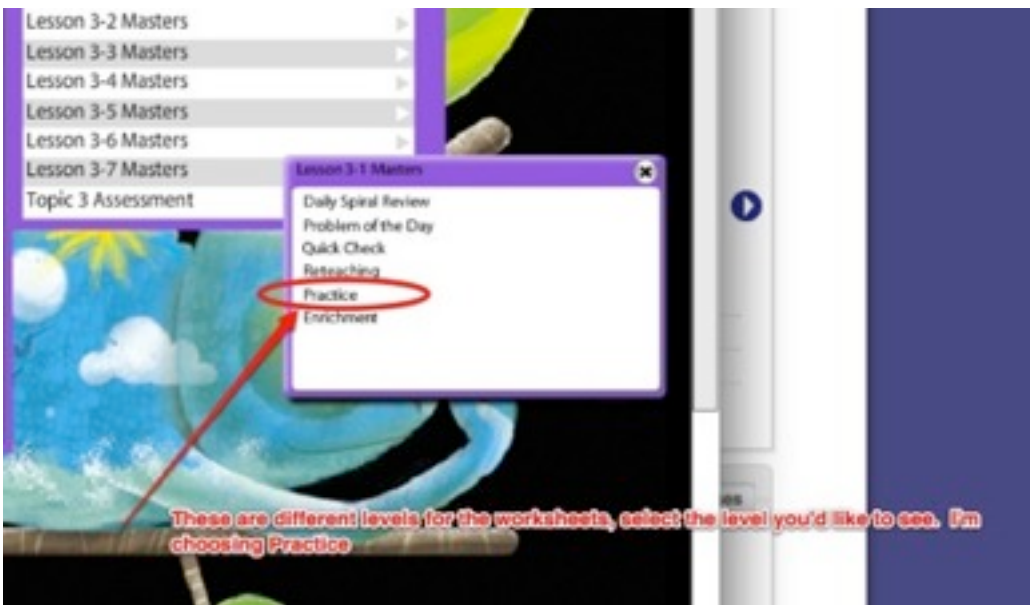


Make sure and click the "printable resources" tab. Sometimes it may take a moment to load once clicked.



Sometimes it may take a moment to load once clicked. This is true for the next couple of steps. Don't get excited and over-click.



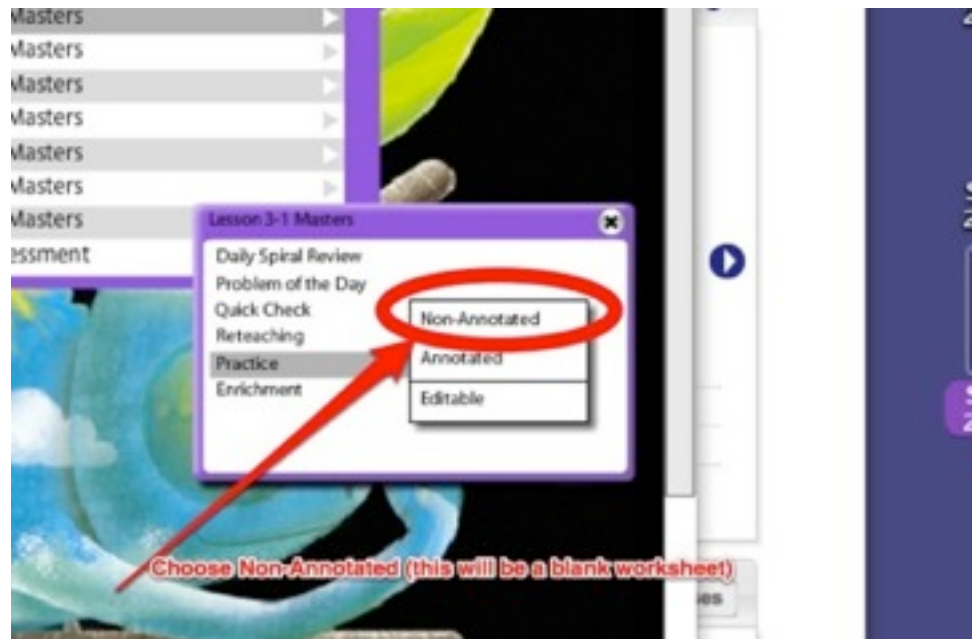


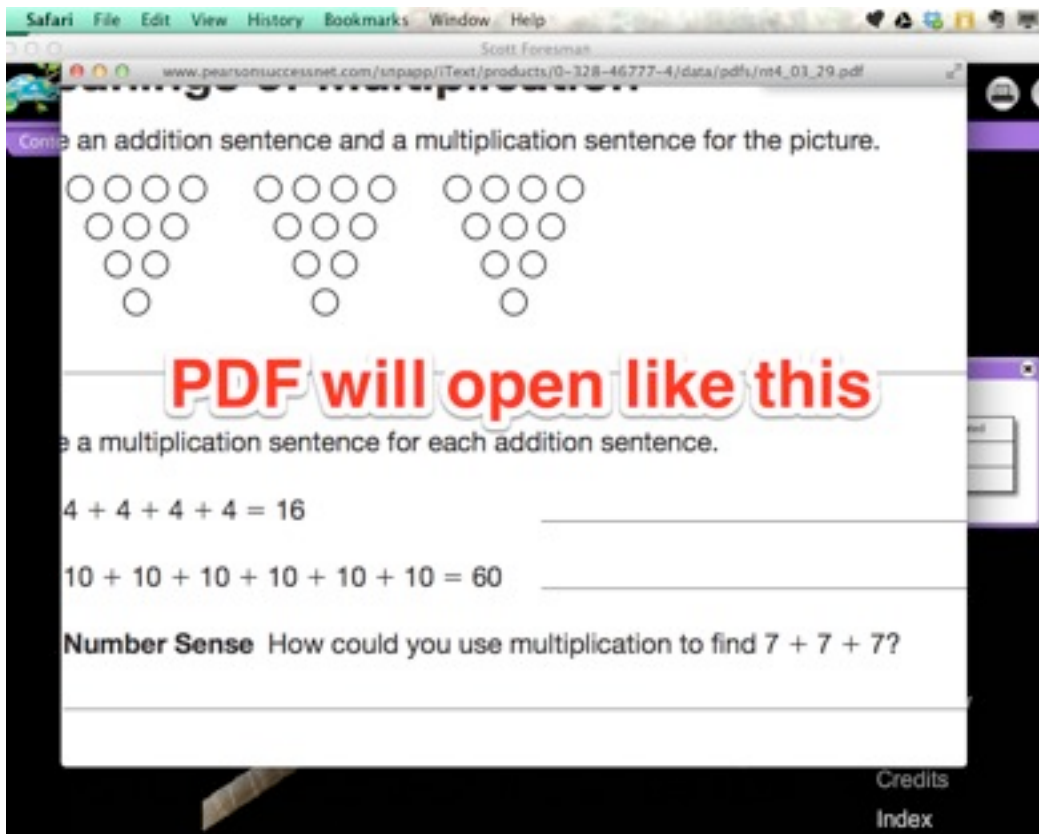
Choose the worksheet you want to save. The options are:

- Daily Spiral Review
  - Problem of the Day
  - Quick Check
  - Reteaching
  - Practice
  - Enrichment
- \*\*It may take a moment for the menu to pop up, be patient.

The three options will come up:

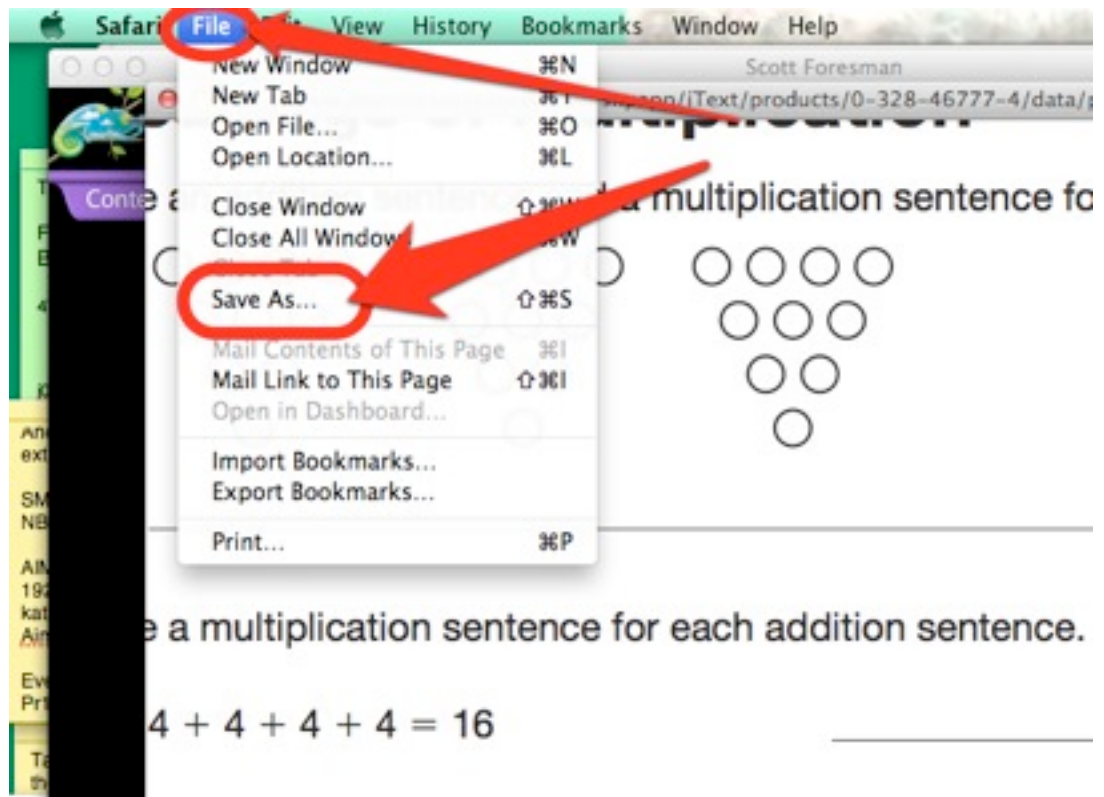
- Non-Annotated (this will be a **blank worksheet**)
- Annotated (this will show the answers in pink words)
- Editable (this will be a Word document that you can change the content on the sheet)

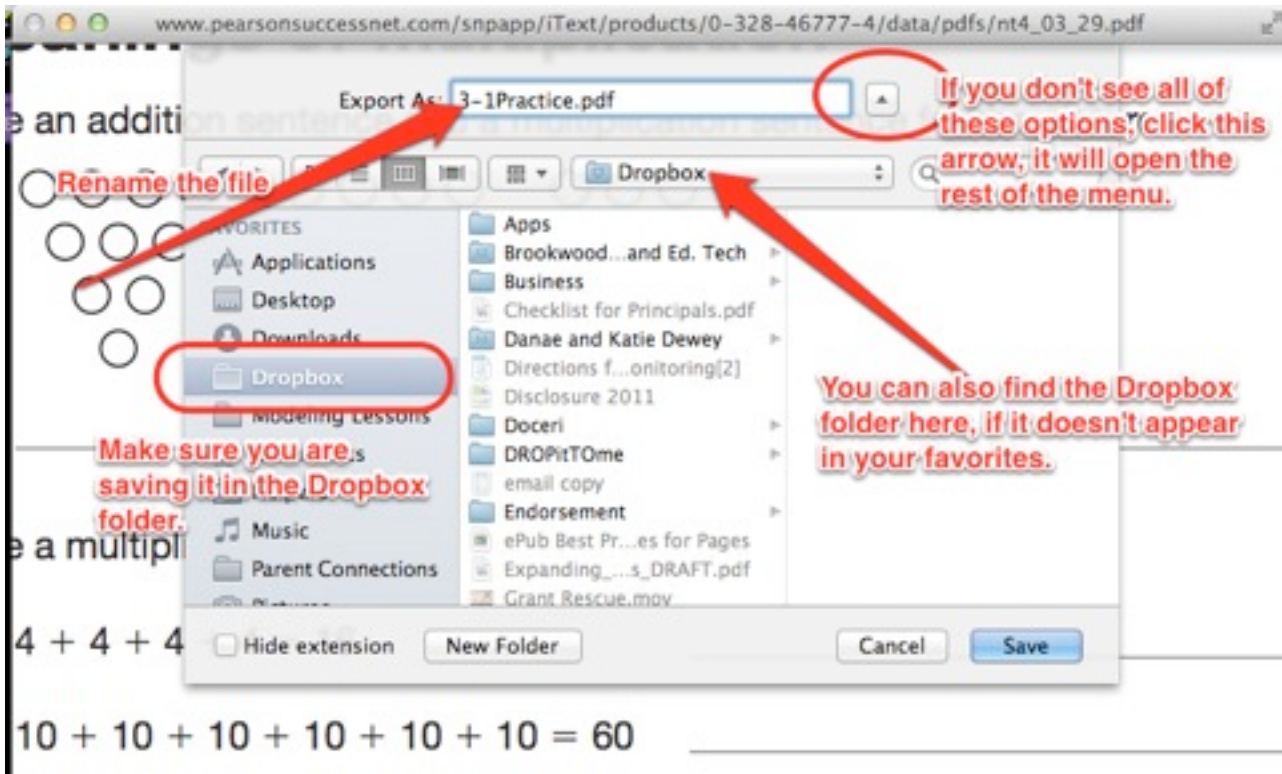




The PDF (worksheet) will open in a new window like this. It's all there, despite the fact that the entire worksheet doesn't appear in the window.

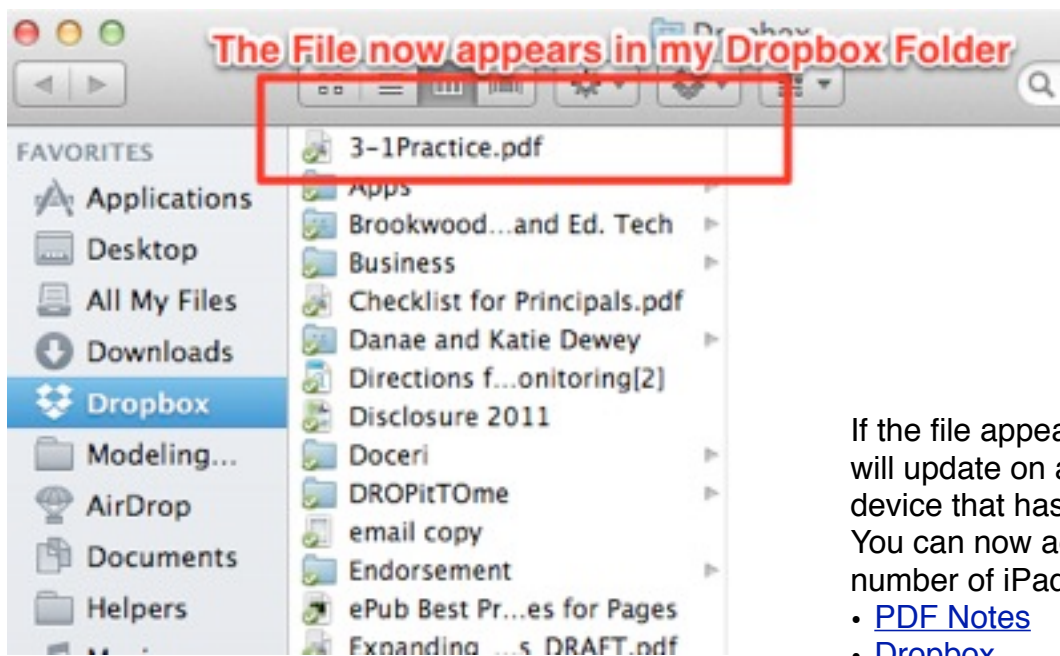
To save the file in Dropbox, click **file** then **save as...**





Some things to consider when saving:

- Rename the file, so you can recognize it when it's saved in another folder.
- Make sure Dropbox is the destination folder
